<u>Christmas Giving In Memoriam</u> A First Church Advent Project ~ Afghanistan Food Crisis

18 million Afghanis are facing serious food shortages as winter approaches. The UN Food Programme estimates that 1 in 3 people are hungry now. This situation will worsen over the coming months.

Why? Ongoing conflicts and the recent Taliban takeover destabilized the country and dried up international aid. Severe drought hurt crop and livestock production. The pandemic has made bad economic conditions worse.

Presbyterian World Service and Development (PWSD) is responding with emergency food assistance in partnership with the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, a consortium of Canadian churches. This project will receive matching funds from the Canadian Government which allows help to reach even more people.

The project gives cash to the most vulnerable families so they can buy food and pay for critical items, with the hopes of livelihood recovery in the new year. This aid is focussed on women-headed households, the elderly and people with disabilities.
