There is no question how important sexual reproductive health awareness is to help create healthy communities.

In Malawi, topics such as sexually transmitted diseases and other reproductive health questions are often considered taboo.

Thokozani, Peter and Mafuno are peer educators who are challenging the stigma surrounding reproductive health by teaching youth about family planning, preventing teenage pregnancy, HIV testing and accessing contraceptives.


Thokozani, Peter and Mafuno have begun see the impact of their work.

"The participants want to start engaging in better and healthier behaviour," Peter reports. "They are now getting tested and treated for sexually transmitted diseases."

The three educators also realize their roles are much bigger than just teaching, "we are role models to these people," Mafuno shares proudly.

First Church Refugee Fund

Our congregation is sponsoring two refugee families who had to flee from civil war and religious persecution.

- <u>The Mathiang family</u> escaped South Sudan in 2014 and live in a UNHCR refugee camp in Sudan.
- <u>The Saleem family</u> fled Pakistan in 2016, and are living in Malaysia. Though not in a camp, their situation is also difficult.

Each family includes five members ranging across three generations - grandparent, parent, child.

Regina's Indigenous Christian Fellowship

Located in North-Central Regina, ICF ministry serves the spiritual and social needs of urban Indigenous people. ICF offers community programming, weekly soup and bannock lunches and family breakfasts, prayer circles, talking circles and pastoral support. The agency partners with other local groups to provide skill building programs.
