#### MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Matthew's unique version of the birth of Jesus traces his family tree all the way from Father Abraham to Jacob, the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary. And then with an astounding departure, says: **“and Mary was the mother of Jesus who is called the Messiah.”**

Matthew says that Joseph nearly divorced Mary on the quiet, he was so distressed by her pregnancy, until the angel of the Lord straightened him out about the nature of her birth. No wonder the line of succession shifted from the father to the mother! Joseph was not the biological father of Jesus!

Yet Joseph proved to be a gracious and loving man. He accepted Mary as his wife and Jesus as his son. And life went on, but certainly not without excitement!

The birth of Jesus brought many fundamental shifts in the beliefs of His day. One was acceptance. He always emphasized openness and a welcoming of absolutely everyone who wanted to be part of His Kingdom. It was a radical departure from the rules and regulations-ridden beliefs of the time. They were more focussed on keeping the unworthy out than on letting them in. Jesus' Gospel is open and welcoming. If you're not against me, I count you as for me - was his approach.

Where are we as His Church today? Are we open and welcoming? At the door of our churches? At our Lord's Table? At the baptismal font? Are we willing to challenge the system, to let people know that they count with us, that we respect each one as God's chosen child, whether we are big or little?

This is a major piece of Matthew's account of the birth of the Christ Child. Isn't it important for us to note and to act accordingly?

May the Christ of Christmas bless us, one and all!

### **BOARD OF MANAGERS**

Thank you for your generous contributions to the life and mission of First Church throughout the year!

Over the last two years we have replaced all of the roofs on the church buildings. Our pledge campaign ends this month and we were able to raise the budgeted amount from the congregation. However, we did spend the majority of our Property Fund, so any contributions to help replenish that fund are appreciated. A full accounting of the roof project will be provided in the new year.

Our Operating Fund is running at a small deficit currently. As you may remember, we set up a contingency fund within our planned giving investments at the last congregational annual meeting. We withdrew \$25,000 from that contingency fund to cover the 2015 deficit. During 2016 we have withdrawn \$15,000 for cash flow purposes and still find ourselves with a deficit. If you are able to make additional contributions to help offset the deficit, that would be appreciated.

### **OUR CHORAL SCHOLARS**

We are delighted to have Will Ireton and Gabe Omolida as our Choral Scholars for the 2016-17 year.

As a returning Choral Scholar, Will is applying what he is learning in the areas of choral conducting, service playing and music selection to enhance our music program and our worship services. Will is majoring in music through Luther College at the University of Regina while also taking lessons on the pipe organ under the tutelage of Hart Godden, Music Director at Knox Metropolitan United Church. He is a member of the U of R Concert Choir and the New Music Ensemble, a group that performs works by contemporary composers, including some of his own compositions. In 2015 he joined the Halcyon Chamber Choir which recently performed with Per Sonatori, Regina's Baroque Ensemble; and in June 2016 Will earned his ARCT (Associate of the Royal Conservatory of Toronto) in Piano Performance. He is active as a pianist in the Regina music community, he competed in the Saskatchewan Music Festival (2016) and is a performer at U of R receptions and ceremonies. In his 'spare' time, Will currently is a lab instructor in keyboard/music theory at the U of R, a piano teacher, and an accompanist for Karen Fransden's voice students.

Gabe Omolida is our newest Choral Scholar. During this his first year as a Choral Scholar, Gabe will gain experience in accompanying the choir and contemporary music groups and will learn basic choral conducting techniques. As a Grade 12 student at the Regina Christian School, Gabe is member of his school's 'select' choir (Grades 9 to 12); and sings and plays the piano as a member of his school's worship team. Gabe has performed at City Hall, Knox-Metropolitan United Church and other churches including the Avonhurst Pentecostal Church. He also performs at other Christian schools and various care facilities in the Regina area including the Wascana Rehabilitation Centre. As well, he participates in his high school's musicals where last year he did a terrific job as Bert in the production of Mary Poppins. Gabe has been taking piano lessons with Gilbert Proulx since 2009, performing in recitals, studying music

theory, and competing in the Saskatchewan Music Festival. He periodically performs for the Freedom 55ers.

We are fortunate to have such young musical talent at First Presbyterian Church!

A focus of the Choral Scholars program is to reach out to the wider music community. We will continue to explore ways to connect with this community and to promote the Choral Scholars program at First Church.

## **CAMP CHRISTOPHER**

Dear Presbyterian & United Congregations,

Thank you for your support and involvement with Camp Christopher over the years. As a congregation of the Presbyterian Synod of Saskatchewan or the United Riverbend Presbytery, we are your camp!

Although the camp property is owned by the Presbyterian Church and the Presbyterian Church oversees the site, maintenance, and development, the program at Camp Christopher has been sponsored and run jointly by the Riverbend Presbytery and the Presbyterian Synod for many years (almost 30 years).

Every summer at Camp Christopher, a significant number of Presbyterian and United Church children and youth participate in the camp program as campers, leaders-in-training, counsellors, and program staff. Church members

also volunteer in various roles such as helping out at the annual Camp Clean-up Weekend, serving as camp chaplains/Bible study leaders, health officers, maintenance or kitchen volunteers. Many of our church women also participate in the annual Women's Camp in September.

We are thrilled to continue the partnership between the Presbyterian and United Churches because Camp Christopher serves children and youth of our congregations and provides leadership training for our youth and young adults. But beyond providing a Christian camping experience for our own young people, the camp is a significant outreach to children and youth without an established connection to any church.

Through our partnership with the Tri4Kids4Camp program in Prince Albert, a large number of campers are sponsored each summer to attend Camp Christopher. This program is a partnership between St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in Prince Albert together with several Community Schools and community members. They raise money every year to send about 150 children to Camp Christopher – children who would not otherwise have such an opportunity, both to experience the wonder of God's Creation and to experience the loving presence of God in Christian community.
