Thank you for your continued generous support of the life of the congregation. While we are still running a deficit for the year, we are gradually making headway. We are in the midst of reconciling the roof pledges and will have a report for the November newsletter.

First Church experienced a break-in during the early hours of September 15. Thieves smashed a window in the Kennedy room, stole groceries from the kitchen, broke windows in the doors to the main office and youth office, stole the candy machine and the youth director laptop. It appears we will likely be submitting a claim as the total cost of the items stolen and the cleanup and repairs will be about \$2700. We have a \$1000 deductible on our policy. The Board is looking at ways to improve security. Bob Dempsey, the caretaker, has trimmed the low-hanging branches on trees in front of the building. We are investigating the cost of putting bars on the Kennedy room windows and upgrading our security system

FUNDSCRIP

Thanks for your continued support of this program. Amazon.ca is a new retailer with the program so you can now purchase Amazon cards. Start to think ahead about Christmas gifts! Specials for October include Giant Tiger at 5% (instead of 3%) and Cabela's at 7% (instead of 4%).

First Church has now been with FundScrip for five years and over that time we have raised almost \$10,000. It happens a few dollars at a time. We would like to encourage more congregants to be involved. It costs you nothing extra and you can use the gift cards like money. Many of our supporters buy all their groceries and gas with gift cards. The church makes money on every card. There are dozens of retailers involved with the program. Pick up an order form and check out the possibilities restaurants, department stores, specialty retailers, and more. KFC and A&W are new this year as well. Orders are placed following the first and third Sundays of the month. Visit the FundScrip table in the gym following worship to place an order or buy cards we have on hand.

If you would like to **order online**, you can set up your own account at FundScrip.com. Use the **invitation code 86MLRU** so that the proceeds go to First Church. Then you can order anytime and your order will be saved until the church order goes through. Your order can then be picked up at the church on the Sunday following the order Sunday. If you choose to do this, please use either Interac or EFT (Electronic Fund Transfer) to pay for your order. You can use a credit card, but if you do, we pay a percentage and the amount the church makes is thereby greatly reduced.

The other possibility with an online account is to have your cards mailed directly to you. You pay the postage and receive up to \$400 in cards in the mail. The church will still earn a percentage. This is a great thing to do if you want to send a card to a friend or family member. You pay the postage and the card is mailed to any address you provide.
