BOOK CLUB

Read with us! The First Church Book Club Since the summer of 2018, a group of First

Church women has been gathering almost every month to discuss a book. (No, the Book Club isn't just for women, but we have yet to



welcome our first male participant.) For a couple of years, we met at the homes of various members and besides the discussion about the book, we enjoyed food, wine, and growing friendships. Once the Pandemic started, we switched to meeting by Zoom video conference, but the reading and the conversations continued.

The book choices each month come from the members, with various people making suggestions and taking turns in leading the discussions. We read lots of fiction and occasional non-fiction. Sometimes we read light-hearted novels and often we read challenging stories that get us thinking about life,

relationships, human nature, God, and much more. We rarely agree about whether we liked a particular book, but we almost always have good discussions, and there's always another opportunity to read another book if we didn't enjoy the last one.

In recent months, I've gotten into the habit of choosing the audio book format for many of the books we are reading together. I love hearing the stories come alive in audio, especially when the author is the reader. There is also the benefit of being able to multi-task while listening.

We would welcome other interested readers and listeners to join us. We usually meet on Wednesday evenings by Zoom, though I expect we might try for some in-person gatherings during the summer when we can meet outside on someone's deck.

Our next gathering is planned for Wednesday, May 31st when we will be discussing The Girls in Navy Blue by Alix Rickloff. It's described as "A gripping and compelling dual-timeline novel about three women who joined the Navy during World War I to become Yeomanettes and the impact their choices have on one of their descendants." Other books on our list coming up include American Dirt by Jeanine Cummins, The Underground Railroad by Colson Whitehead, and The Red Tent by Anita Diamant.


