MINISTER'S MESSAGE

It's September and the beginning of another active season in the life of the church! All our regular programs and groups are starting up again this month, and there are special events happening as well. It's an important time to pay attention to the announcements, read the newsletter, and plan to get involved in the ministry and mission that we share at First Church!

First and foremost, I hope you won't miss the chance to get your photo taken this weekend for our new church directory. Photo sessions are only 15 minutes, and there is no cost to you unless you want to purchase photos. I was recently reminded, however, that the church is not all about programs and events. Sometimes the announcements make it seem like programs are our top priority. But in fact, programs and special events are just a medium for bringing us together to be the church community that we are called to be.

I often talk about our congregation as a family – the First Church Family – because our community really does feel like a family to me. When I recently celebrated a milestone birthday, I felt surrounded by your love as you celebrated with me. When one family in our congregation experienced a tragic loss recently, others rallied around them to offer support and care. We don't always do this perfectly and sometimes we miss an opportunity to care for one another through the ups and downs of our lives, but this is the kind of community that we are striving to be.

Over the next several weeks, our Sunday services will include readings from the Letter of

James to the early Christian Churches. James' letter includes lots of really practical advice for those earliest church families on how to live out their faith and enact God's love in the world.

James is very clear that being a Christian is not just about believing certain things or being assured that we are saved by God's love and grace in Jesus Christ. Being a Christian means living a transformed life, and the Christian community or the family of the church is the best place to learn and practice that way of living that we first saw demonstrated in the life of Jesus.

Consider these lovely words from James 5:13-16. In the midst of whatever programs and events we share this Fall together, I trust we'll also be learning to be there for each other like this:

"Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up, and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective."

We are blessed to have you in our church family, whether you are at the programs and events, worshipping on Sundays in the sanctuary, or joining us online. Please never hesitate to share your joys and struggles with your church family so that we can pray for you, share your burdens, and grow in faith and love together.

<u>UPCOMING WEBINAR:</u> <u>The PCC, Colonization and</u> Residential Schools

September 30th marks National Day for Truth and Reconciliation (also known as Orange Shirt Day): a day created to honour residential school Survivors as well as those children who never made it home. In preparation for marking this day, come and learn about the church's role in colonization and residential schools, the ongoing effects the schools have caused, and ways in which the PCC is engaging in reconciliation today.

A webinar titled The PCC, Colonization and Residential Schools will take place on Thursday September 26th at 1pm Eastern as part of the church's continued response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Call to Action # 59, which calls on churches to educate their members about the role churches played in colonization, the history and legacy of residential schools and why apologies to former residential school students, their families and communities are necessary.

The webinar will take a look at some of the PCC's history, setting it in the context of broader history and the Doctrine of Discovery, and will also look at the effects of trauma and intergenerational trauma the schools caused. It concludes with information about some of the things the PCC is doing today in its ongoing work toward truth, healing, and reconciliation in order to better equip people within the PCC to engage in reconciliation.

How to: 1. take donations to SARCAN




- 2. enter through the "drop 'n go" door if there is one, or just go inside


THE CANADIAN COUNCIL OF CHURCHES
